





Our current relationship with trash is one of neglect. We have made our very best effort to create a system to remove our waste from our lives as quickly and concealed as possible, and in doing so have often failed to respect and acknowledge this vital infrastructure, while also ignoring responsible waste habits and the impacts our current behaviors have. This project aims to increase the visibility of our waste system and associated infrastructure in order to promote more respect and awareness of the system, responsible waste habits, and understanding of our waste's impacts.

waste today

In 2012, the United States generated 251 tons of municipal solid waste, and diverted 87 million tons of that via recycling or composting. These calculations mean that every day, Americans produce 4.38 pounds of waste and recycle or compost 1.51 pounds of that. Figures 1, 2, and 3 illustrate the breakdown of the total waste stream, diverted waste, and non-diverted waste by material.


